

The book of Numbers which we are reading at the moment is about the journey in the wilderness where the Israelites transform from a people into a nation.

The main theme of the book of Numbers is so appealing and engaging because it epitomises our lives. We embark on many journeys in our lives both as individuals and as a community and what we learn or don't on each journey makes an impact on our next one.

We also realise on those journeys that individuals can have a big impact on us, our group, and the time it would take to get to our current destination. I would like to share with you one such journey of our members to the Czech

Republic. When 9 of us embarked on the

know each other or the impact which that shared journey would make on us.

The most impactful part of the trip was the people that we met through our journey: our Czech friend Julius Muller, without whose support and translation in our meetings in Sobeslav we would have been lost in the wilderness of the Czech language; Rabbi David Maxa and his warm and welcoming community, so many new friends we made in Sobeslav starting from the Lord Mayor and Monica, the smiling owner of the former Sobeslav's synagogue building and finishing with Michael Macovec, the son of the last survivor (Naomi) of Sobeslav and Mr. Jundra, the teacher in Sobeslav's Gymnasium who started the well-known programme in the Czech republic now called "Our disappeared neighbours" – collections of the stories about the disappeared Jewish neighbours which the students researched in their local areas. We felt safe and welcomed in the Czech Republic as Jews.

The trip brought alive faces of the members of the Sobeslav community, who perished in the Holocaust. Our Czech scroll became even more dear to us because it encompasses now for us the memory of all those people behind it who didn't make it through the war but also

it now symbolises hope for the future. The flourishing Jewish life of the Czech Republic, our new friends and the Czech people who are trying to learn from their history. It was exciting to be a part of this evolving history but also to bring those new friendships back to EHRS.

The inspiration for us came not just from the Jewish history which was unveiled in front of our eyes but also from all the encounters with non-Jewish people we had on our 5 day journey. It was emotional for our group to be a part of making history and us together adding a new page into the message of friendship and peaceful co-existence.

We went on the trip as individuals but came back together as a group of friends. We had some fun together too! Most unfortunately, I have to tell you that what happened in the Czech Republic has to stay in the Czech Republic, but if you are around on 15 November please join our Czech Friday night service followed by a bring share dinner featuring Czech cuisine and drinks. We will share some of the great stories with you then and many photos from our Czech adventure!

We are planning a young people's Czech trip in 2025 and another adult trip in spring 2026.

EHRS - Tour to Prague & Sobeslav

The members trip in May, proved to be quite an adventure, full of incredible historical sites, wonderful people, and the start of a warm relationship between EHRS and Sobeslav, the home of our Czech Torah Scroll.

On our first full day, we were given a tour of Sobeslav, visiting the houses that used to belong to the Jewish families who lived there. We were joined by Julius Muller a local historian, Michael Makovec and his family, who are descendants of one of the original Jewish families, and the current occupants of the private residence that stands on the site of the former synagogue, Dana and Monika Slaba. Together, we recited and sang memorial prayers to honour the memories of the lost Jewish community of Sobeslav. We were officially welcomed by the Mayor Jindřich Bláha, and also spent time at the Gymnasium where we met with inspirational teacher Radim Jindra, who has been honoured at Yad Vashem for his work in Holocaust education. Following a spot of lunch and some retail therapy, we then headed deep into the overgrown forest, on the outskirts of the town, to the old Jewish Cemetery. Standing amongst the stones, under a bright blue sky, surrounded by fallen trees, and listening to the bird song, was a deeply moving experience.

Day two we enjoyed a guided walking tour of Prague's Jewish Quarter, visiting many of the historic synagogues, to learn about the history of this fascinating country and the daily lives of the 35,000 Jews, who had lived there prior to WW2. We joined Rabbi David Maxa and the members of the Ec Chajim Reform Synagogue for their Friday night service, where Rabbi Tanya spoke about our connections and joint friendship, finishing with a delicious meal at the beautiful home of Jonathan Wootliff, one of their congregants.


Our last full day was spent at Theresienstadt (in Czech Terezín). This was where, in November 1942, all the Jews from Sobeslav, alongside others from surrounding villages in the Tabor region were deported to, before being sent on to in 1943 to Auschwitz to be murdered. We finished our visit with El Male Rachamim and Kaddish - may their memory be a continuing blessing.

On our last morning in Prague we managed a quick visit to the magnificent Jubilee Synagogue, sampled some amazing Czech cakes, and reflected on our shared experiences.

EHRS has a proud history that goes back to 1935. Now, having embraced the Jewish community of Sobeslav through being entrusted with the legacy of one of their Torah Scrolls, we have a community history that stretches back to the 16th century. As individuals we come from a scattered heritage across Europe, but the Scroll from Sobeslav offers us insights into one community's history that we now all share, and the connections and friendships that we have built during this trip, offer opportunities for return visits in the future.




