

FROM A CURSED YEAR TO A BLESSED YEAR

Our new Machzor for the High Holidays will introduce us to a medieval Rosh Hashanah poem attributed to Avraham Hazzan of Gerona called Achot Katana, The Little Sister: 'The little sister sets out her prayers and sings her words of praise. God please heal all her sickness, May this year with its curses, be over.' The 'little sister' of the poem is our people Israel, based on an image in Song of Songs 8:8. What a year it has been for us. Soon after the start of 5784 we learned in horror about the attacks by Hamas on kibbutzim, army bases and towns and the Nova music festival killing so many of our people, including a child of the EHRS community, and the taking of hundreds hostage to Gaza, including friends of EHRS members. At the time of writing this High Holy Days message over 100 are still captives.

What has unfolded since that time has made the year feel cursed. It has included

intimidating protests by those who can only see the other as a threat whether protesting apparently in support of Palestinians or against refugees to this country. It has included seeing the devastation Hamas's attacks and Israel's military campaign brought about in Gaza, the evacuation of far Northern Israel as Hezbollah attacked, the continued attacks by Russia on Ukraine and this summer even the murder of children at a summer scheme in Southport.

Yet to call 5784 cursed fails to paint a true picture of the resilience that this little sister, this people Israel is capable of. Our own community, EHRS, refused to be cowed by the security threat that the Hamas attacks might have inspired. Our services, learning, and all-generations activities rapidly returned to their normal thriving selves in October. We joined solidarity demonstrations for Israel and for the release of the hostages in Gaza. We found that Israel herself was her regular argumentative self, continuing to build a society for all kinds of Jews and her Arab citizens. We hosted many visitors from Israel, finding refuge at first and then coming to teach us about the country today. We got to know the families of hostages in Gaza so that they knew their fellow Jews care. Our EHRS Interfaith activities grew more than in many previous years as we welcomed Muslim guests to our Iftar, were a major participant in the local Interfaith Walk and received messages of solidarity from our local churches and supported our local mosques when they felt under threat. We continued to build our community, literally as you will see when you come on the High Holy Days. We did not allow a tough year to threaten our core values as a Jewish community.

The Achot Katana poem continues: Be brave and rejoice, for destruction is past, trust in God, whose covenant with you stands. You will go up to Zion, for God has said: build up, build up her highway (Isaiah 62:10). When it was written, in the thirteenth century, Jews were right in the middle of another period where persecution was just as likely as peaceful co-existence. As always it is only resilience and a determination to build a better future that makes life worthwhile, as a people or as individuals.

So this year EHRS will be running an Israel trip to give us all the opportunity to experience the Jewish state at this pivotal time. This year too we will continue to invest in being the best Jewish community that we can be, helping our members and the thousands who visit us over the course of a year gain strength, care and understanding from this great Synagogue - your help for this effort will be most welcome!

The final words of the Achot Katana are 'May this year, with its blessings, begin!' The Clergy team of Rabbis and Cantor of EHRS wishes you and all who are special to you a sweet and good 5785 and if that is tough to enjoy then know that we are always here for you.

MESSAGE FROM OUR CHAIRMAN

Rosh Hashanah is often considered as a time for self-reflection, change and new beginnings. Whilst we may sing Auld Lang Syne on 31 December/1 January there is no such song for us. It is often confusing for non-Jewish people when we tell them that to celebrate our new year, we are in Synagogue praying for forgiveness for our sins for several hours for 2 days. To be honest sometimes it's confusing for Jews as well! Some of the melodies and prayers that we only come across once a year make us smile and reminisce but even once a year familiarity can sometimes breed contempt and we get bored or drift off during a service. This year as I'm sure you will have heard, for the first time in 40 years we will have

a new Machzor. In 1985 when I joined

Middlesex New Synagogue it was the first year that a new machzor was in use. I was excited to take part in a Reform High Holy Day Service and the community were excited to use a new Machzor, giving them the opportunity to enjoy a new service. Rabbi Franses z"I made that first Musaf service last over 3 hours but fortunately timings have improved and EHRS now has it down to a fine art.

Now it's all change. I have had a sneak preview of the Machzor, and our own Rabbi Mark played a huge part in its creation. We can be very proud. There are new prayers, new study passages, new explanations and new songs to learn as well. The Jewish Religion should keep changing and not get into a rut and this new Machzor is very much part of that

ethos. I hope that everyone will find something new as well as something familiar in it. Members of the community will be able to purchase a book either in honour of someone or simply donate one to the shul. Please contact the shul office if you would like to donate a book.

As you enter the shul premises these High Holy Days you will also see a big change to the outside of our building. The builders have been hard at work during the Summer and by the time Rosh Hashanah arrives you will all arrive at the shul, stop, say "wow" and enter the building to enjoy our services.

85. We aim to prioritise calls to those members in greatest need, for example if they are isolated and particularly if they are housebound. These phone calls are so important to each recipient and can be a lifeline for them. Our wonderful volunteers phone their allocated members at least three times a year before major festivals and often more frequently.

They build a telephone relationship and both caller and recipient get a great deal from this. We need more volunteers as without your help we cannot keep in touch with everyone and provide this support. As a Telenet volunteer you can make your calls from the comfort of your own home at a time that is convenient to you and training will be provided. This is such a lovely project to be involved in so why not try it?! Please contact us for more details.

Lunch Club and the EHRS Memory Way Café will be closed during October for the High Holy Days. Lunch Club dates for the rest of the year are 12 November and 10 December and Memory Way Café dates are 20 November and 18 December. Booking is essential for both.





Nagila supported the night shelter again this year by providing hamantaschen and other cakes at Purim. The Stanmore branch of Wenzel's also provided surplus

bread, cakes and vegetarian sandwiches most weeks.

This year, for the first time, our homeless guests hosted a volunteers for dinner at St Paul's Church Hall in Mill Hill. One of our guests gave a heartfelt speech of thanks, explaining the difference that the night shelter made to her life. Thankfully she is now comfortably housed.

We couldn't make this happen without our lovely team of volunteers, support from the EHRS caretaking team, on-site security and the Office Manager

Selichot: Saturday 28 September, 20:00-00:15

We will start the evening joining with Reform Jewish communities around the world through video technology to build a feeling of Jewish solidarity as we come to the end of a very challenging year for Jews everywhere. We continue with the film 'The Jazz Singer'. After a break for refreshments, at 23:00 we will begin our beautiful choral service.

Erev Rosh Hashanah: Wednesday 2 October

We will begin with our Erev Rosh Hashanah Service at 18:30, and offer a session An Awesome Day in a Terrible Year at 19:00

First Day Rosh Hashanah: Thursday 3 October

We will hold a Shacharit & Musaf (Additional) Service, at 10:00 followed by Kiddush.
