### Monthly Musings

Rabbi Mark Goldsmith



Chanukkah has a long history of observance but also a long history of transformation. It began as the celebration of the victory of the Maccabees over the Syrian Greek Empire in 164BCE and the restoration of the Temple in Jerusalem, bringing the Jewish Hasmonean dynasty into power as the rulers over Israel.

By the time of the Talmud in the fifth Century, the Hasmoneans had long since blotted their copybook by having fallen into internecine feuding and then having the great idea of asking the Romans to help, who then ended up taking over Israel for the next four centuries.

So, in the Talmud, Chanukkah becomes the festival of the miracle of the Menorah in the Temple lasting lit for eight days on one day's supply of oil. It became God's miracle and not the Maccabees'!

Chanukkah remained a minor festival then for centuries until Jews became ever more involved in societies which were Christian, and were no longer confined to ghettos.

By the Nineteenth Century, especially in Northern Europe, the popularity of Christmas as a big scale celebration with Christmas markets, light displays, Christmas Trees, presents for children and much more beyond the original church festival meant that Jewish families needed to find something just as delightful to help their children to feel equally excited, around the same time of the year. So Chanukkah became the time when Jewish children could gently one-up their Christian friends by saying that they got eight nights of presents and not just one! The light of the family Chanukkiah was just as heart-warming as any Christmas tree and family and Synagogue gatherings made Chanukkah seem no longer to be a minor festival.

As this historical journey took place it may also be that both Chanukkah and Christmas rediscovered their pre Jewish roots, as festivals of light in midwinter, common to so many cultures. You can't beat a festival of light to push out the winter blues.

In December's What's On you will find personal, communal and local area ways to bring light. There is our wonderful Chanukkah programme, including a candle lighting by Zoom or in person every night of Chanukkah, culminating in our Chanukkah Fireworks event on January 1st in our new EHRS Courtyard.

There is our reminder that the ERHS Community Needs Fund is always available to EHRS members to help when heating or any of the necessities for safe and comfortable life are not affordable – so that we bring light to each other. Also on page 14 you will see the invitation to volunteer to bring light to the homeless people of our area by volunteering at the EHRS Homeless Shelter this winter.

You too can join the Maccabees and the Almighty in making little miracles happen.

Are you struggling to cope financially? The EHRS Community Needs Fund enables us to help each other.

The fund makes grants of up to a few hundred pounds to help members access health services, prevent eviction from home, put food on the table, renew or repair basic equipment when it is broken (such as a bed or a fridge), afford school uniforms and many other needs. To access the fund there is a simple, non-intrusive, form which is available from any of the EHRS Clergy or the Community Care team. Just phone or email any of them at the Synagogue.

All grants are absolutely confidential and should not be seen as charity, but rather as enabling our members to do the mitzvah of Gemilut Chasadim, spreading loving kindness in the world.

#### **Erev Shabbat Service**

Our Erev Shabbat Service takes place every Friday Evening. Led by our Rabbis in person at our Synagogue and through the EHRS Livestream Classic Channel. They give a beautiful sense of rest and togetherness to help you to cope with the stresses of the world.

#### **Shabbat Morning Service**

Our Shabbat Morning Service is held in the EHRS Beit Tefillah (sanctuary). The service is also available on the EHRS Livestream Classic Channel.



#### **Children's Shabbat Experiences**

We aim for there to be a special Shabbat experience for children pretty much every week at EHRS. Our Shabbat Shirah and Shabbat Club on respectively the second and fourth Shabbat each month are especially created for children to enjoy. On the first and third Shabbat, from 10:45-11:15 our clergy and educators run a Story, Snack and Song time or Build a Bible sessions for any children that would like to join them. See Our Week Ahead for what is on this week. All are suitable for collecting CRP points for Jewish schools.

#### Kuddle Up Shabbat

Our special interactive Shabbat service for Primary aged children and their siblings. Songs, stories and activities. You can collect CRP points from attending. Early arrival is optional from 15.45. Come straight from school pick up, or just arrive early to play before the service. Selection of toys for the children and hot drinks available for the adults. In December it's a Kuddle Up Chanukkah special to get you ready for the Jewish festival of light.

#### **Early Risers Service**

This especially friendly service is mostly in Hebrew, uses nusach (traditional modes of chant for the prayers), include the Torah reading and Musaf (which is the repetition of the Amidah special to Shabbat) and other features to create a participative experience, ending with a hospitable Kiddush.

#### Sunday Shacharit

Half an hour of morning prayer with a friendly bunch of folks, includes the Kaddish if you are remembering a loved one. On the first Sunday of each month, it includes a bagel breakfast.

#### Shabbat Morning 21 December

This service is our Hava Nashira service. Singers will be dotted around the congregation rather than concentrated in the choir space. Enjoy singing with us all.
